
Note of the Leadership Webinar

#### **About the webinar**

Homeless Link ran a webinar on lived experience and leadership for established and emerging leaders in the homelessness sector on 10 January 2024.

Homeless Link's lived experience partner for its leadership programmes, Sunny Dhadley, led the session. Experts by experience from a range of organisations led breakout sessions on a range of topics.



The webinar provided a useful opportunity for more than 160 participants from the homelessness sector (from more than 100 organisations including from charities, housing associations, local authorities, and other government bodies) to contribute to learning about the relevance of lived experience to leadership, priorities, and opportunities for action.

## **Key themes**

Dialogue during and after the webinar demonstrates that there is a strong appetite for the equitable involvement of people with lived experience in a variety of ways within organisations. Some are further along with this journey, whilst others are at the start. Nevertheless, the conversations, feedback and actions recorded demonstrate the ongoing commitment to lived experience; from funding specific lived experience posts, reviewing and updating strategy, achieving best practice, creating more robust pathways, to diversifying boards, and more.

Organisations positively highlighted that they generally have staff and volunteers with lived experience, however ensuring that the right level of support is in place, dealing with time pressures and further improving diversity (particularly at a senior/board level) was seen as a challenge.
