1 Familiarise yourself with the key Principles and non-negotiables of Housing First and examples of implementation in England. Reach out to commissioners of existing Housing First services.

Developing a Housing First service in your area

- 2 Engage relevant stakeholders throughout the process (include strategic decision makers, cross-sector commissioners and housing providers); talk them through the Principles and ethos of Housing First.
 - Map the need in your area using the eligibility and referrals briefing.
 - Determine the capacity of your service and the resource required to fund the support
 - Plan for support team based on caseload size of 1 senior support worker to 5-7 clients with adequate management support
 - Read our <u>research on the costs</u> of Housing First in England
 - Ensure funding covers additional costs outlined in our guidance for commissioners
 - Determine how housing will be accessed and what flexibility is required to support this (e.g. direct lets, high banding on choice based lettings). Work with housing partners to get buy-in.
 - Develop a service specification based on your plans. Examples are here. Ensure that expected outcomes are realistic and in line with the Housing First Principles.

How-to guide for commissioners

7 Develop a steering group that can oversee the service once it's up and running and help overcome operational challenges.

From engaging to sustaining
