THE HOSTILE ENVIRONMENT - NHS

Charging for NHS Care

- Statutory duty to charge
- Upfront charging for 'non-urgent' secondary care
- Increased visa fees to use the NHS

Sharing Patient Data with the Home Office

- Sharing data to identify people that may be chargeable
- Sharing information about debt to the NHS

Racial Profiling and Discrimination

- ID checks in hospitals
- Legitimising discrimination
- Threatening attendance forms





THE HOSTILE ENVIRONMENT - WHO DOES IT IMPACT

- Undocumented Migrants
 - o 600,000 1 million people
- Asylum Seekers & Refugees
 - o About 200,000 people
- Non-UK born population
 - o 14% of the population
- Racialised people (regardless of citizenship)
 - o 13% of the population
- People without ID
 - o 17% of people hold no passport





THE HOSTILE ENVIRONMENT - WHO DOES IT IMPACT

What does it mean for EU citizens now?

- EU Nationals with Settled and Pre-Settled status are entitled
- Those with a pending application also entitled
- Otherwise now chargeable for secondary care

What about people with NRPF?

- NRPF is not the same as entitlement to use the NHS (though a lot of crossover!)
- Can have knock on effects about ability to access care

THE IMPACT OF THE POLICIES?

- Charging? People forced to choose between destitution and good health. Delays and denial of care. Fear and deterrence from seeking care.
- Data sharing? Racial profiling and discrimination
- Health worker relationships with patients? Lack of trust and worsening relationship with health workers
- **Public health?** Makes it impossible for communities to protect themselves, especially during coronavirus





EVIDENCE OF IMPACT

Doctors of the World

- Delays average 37 weeks
- o 1 in 5 unable to register with a GP

Patients Not Passports

 57% of support organisations reported migrants too afraid to come forward, even if reassured by caseworkers

Public Health England

 Hostile Environment played causative role in disproportionate impact of COVID on BAME communities

Key Research

- Increase in time to diagnosis and time to treat for people with TB not born in the UK
- o Children denied urgent cancer treatment
- o Pregnant women avoid seeking maternity care
