NCL ICS Structure

In April 2020 the five Clinical Commissioning Groups in North Central London (NCL CCGs) – Barnet, Camden, Enfield, Haringey and Islington – merged to form one CCG in line with the NHS Long Term Plan.

Borough partnerships have been formed in each borough to support working at a 'place' level and we have 32 thriving primary care networks (PCNS) and 5 Integrated Care Partnerships (ICPs)

The NCL Homelessness Vision - DRAFT

To support all rough sleepers, multiple exclusion homeless, those in encampments, vulnerable people in temporary accommodation, hidden homeless. To move people on to appropriate permanent accommodation and provide access to integrated housing, health, care, employment and community support to transition into a sustained recovery from homelessness.

North Central London

Out of Hospital Care Model (OOHCM) test site

Remit is to support discharge from hospital for persons who are homeless / at risk of homeless person

The Haringey Homeless Health Inclusion team (HHHIT)

• GP, paramedic and care navigators. "HHHIT significantly improved the access to primary care and holistic health assessments and healthcare for vulnerable and homeless people in Haringey".

Camden's Homeless MDT team

• Remit to provide onsite healthcare to a target cohort of homeless people resident in the Camden Adult Hostel Pathway.

FOCUS in Camden

 mental health outreach team for street homeless adults. The service offers assessment and treatment service for mental health issues and support with housing and benefits as well as education, employment and physical health needs.

Islington the Westminster Drug Project (WDP)

Remit is street support for rough sleepers aged 18+ who are experiencing substance misuse issues. The service offers
wraparound intensive outreach support including dual diagnosis, specialist outreach for women, outreach workers and a
clinical lead

Crisis cafes

across NCL which offer an alternative to people using the emergency department for crisis support

NCL ICS focus on homelessness healthcare provision



NCL Borough Homeless meeting – since April 2020 - Monthly

- Regular meeting with commissioning, housing, rough sleeper/homeless team, public health, clinical lead
- Coordination of various services and resources such as Covid pathways, vaccination, discharge models, primary care, NRPF

Coproduction

Ensuing residents voice is heard. Utilise when we need to support shaping services.

Education

- Camden homelessness network Quarterly. Includes primary care, secondary care, VCS, Safeguarding, Police.
- During height of Covid pandemic fortnightly seminars with accommodation staff to help them manage complex clients, discuss new pathways and provide information on vaccination.

Clinical lead GP for homelessness developing services.

- Expertise and guidance on homeless health services
- Engagement and training for practitioners and staff
- Inclusion health clinical lead would be ideal e.g. sex workers/hidden homelessness.
